The Meeting convened at 1 p.m. by Mr. Dennis Bray and introductions were made.

BAGLEY-KEENE OPEN MEETING ACT AND VERTEBRATE PEST CONTROL RESEARCH ADVISORY COMMITTEE COMPLIANCE

Mr. Bray and the Committee acknowledged the Vertebrate Pest Control Research Advisory Committee (VPCRAC) compliance with the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act.

MINUTES FOR APRIL 30, 2014 MEETING

Motions: Ruben Arroyo moved that the Committee recommend approving the

minutes from the April 30, 2014 meeting. The motion was seconded

by Paul Stapp and passed unanimously.

MINUTES FOR OCTOBER 22, 2014 MEETING

Motions: Mark Novak moved that the Committee recommend approving the

minutes from the October 22, 2014 meeting. The motion was

seconded by Paul Stapp and passed unanimously.

CDFA UPDATES

Mr. David Kratville explained that CDFA requested a motion from the Committee to approve pursuing efforts to amend Legislation to extend VPCRAC rodenticide surcharge authorization.

Motions: Karen Sweet moved that the Committee recommend approve the

pursuit of legislation authorizing the extension of the rodenticide surcharge and the VPCRAC. The motion was seconded by David

Kratville and passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mr. Kratville stated the FY 2015/2016 budget line items were adjusted after the October 22, 2014 meeting. He presented an option in the new budget that would pay for registration fees for CDFA maintained rodenticide labels rather than passing those fees on to the participating counties. The costs for the CDFA maintained rodenticide labels will be reflected in the final FY 2015/2016 budget.

Motions: Karen Sweet moved that the Committee recommend approving the

Financial Reports as presented. The motion was seconded by Paul

Stapp and passed unanimously.

Motions: Dennis Bray moved that the Committee recommend approving the

Proposed Budget to include the pesticide registration fees as a line item charged directly to VPCRAC. The motion was seconded by

Ruben Arroyo and passed unanimously.

GUIDELINES FOR RESEARCH PROPOSALS

Ms. Michelle Dennis presented research proposal guidelines that would include a limit of 10 percent overhead for VPCRAC funded research. The Committee discussed the need to identify VPCRAC research needs. The proposal guidelines include a section where the Committee can identify areas of research that are of particular importance to the program. These suggestions will continue to be discussed and updated at future meetings.

Discussion followed.

Motions: Paul Stapp moved that the Committee recommend approval to set a

10 percent overhead for all research proposals. The motion was

seconded by Mark Novak and passed unanimously.

RESEARCH PROPOSALS

Motions: David Kratville moved that the Committee recommend funding the

research proposal from Dr. Roger Baldwin, UC Davis and Gary

Witmer, National Wildlife Research Center, "A Field test of Rodenticides for Pocket Gopher (Thomomys spp.) Control" in the

amount of \$43,514.55. The motion was seconded by Robert Timm

and passed unanimously.

Motions: Ruben Arroyo moved that the Committee recommend funding the

research proposal from Dr. Roger Baldwin, UC Davis, "Encouraging Owl Predation of Rodents by Erecting Owl Boxes: Myth or Potential Management Strategy?" in the amount of \$76,908.15. The motion was seconded by Robert Timm and passed with a majority vote of

five Yeas and one Nay. Paul Stapp abstained from voting.

Motions: Mark Novak moved that the Committee recommend funding the

research proposal from Dr. Katherine Horak, National Wildlife

Research Center, "Evaluation of the Hazard of Sequential Exposures

to First and Second Generation Anticoagulant Rodenticides Encountered by Non-Target Raptors at the Urban-Agricultural

Interface" in the amount of \$142,946. The motion was seconded by

Paul Stapp and passed unanimously.

PURSUING A CALIFORNIA SPECIAL LOCAL NEEDS LABEL FOR ZINC PHOSPHIDE ON CABBAGE

Mr. Bray presented Modoc County Agricultural Commissioner's preliminary Special Local Need label for Zinc Phosphide treated cabbage for controlling Belding's ground squirrels. Belding's ground squirrels do not readily take grain based baits and

historically were controlled by applications of cabbage treated with Compound 1080. The state of Oregon recently permitted the use of Zinc Phosphide treated cabbage for this pest.

Mr. Kratville requested feedback from the Committee to pursue a statewide CDFA Zinc Phosphide label for the Belding's ground squirrels and other rodent pests that do not readily take grain based baits. The Committee recognized the need for the label and is interested in reviewing more research regarding the suggested label. The Committee recommended presenting the topic as an agenda item for discussion during the next meeting.

Discussion followed.
